Awarding Orchids

Orchid growers sometimes will ask an orchid Judge "is my orchid awardable?" There is much more to this apparently simple question than meets the eye. The judging system within the Australian Orchid Council has been in use for many years. This system is used to judge individual orchids where the owner has requested an assessment of a plant, award orchids judged to be of superior quality, to judge orchids at a show, and to judge orchids benched at a society meeting.

If a grower thinks that one of their orchids may be worthy of an award, a Judge should be contacted and the Area Registrar or the Area Assistant Registrar should be notified. Three judges will arrange to view the orchid and if they think it should be looked at by a full panel, the area Registrar will arrange for a panel to be convened. Usually, 2 or 3 days' notice is required so that judges can do some research on the plant concerned. Within the judging system, there are the following awards possible:

- A Highly Commended Certificate where the plant must gain from 75pts to 79.9 pts.
- An Award of Merit where the plant must gain from 80pts to 84.9pts.
- A First Class Certificate where the plant must gain 85pts and above and these three awards are referred to as 'quality awards'. It goes without saying that a plant that gains an FCC would be truly exceptional.

There are other awards including a Cultural Award which is given to the owner of the plant for excellence of culture, a Certificate of Botanical Merit for a species or natural hybrid which is rare or unusual in cultivation, and an Award of Distinction for a feature which is outstandingly distinctive e.g. unusual colour.

This orchid is Cattleya Dal's Tradition.

This orchid gained a Highly Commended Certificate of 77.5 points at a special judging in 2007. Notice how the outline of the flower forms a circle going from the very top of the dorsal sepal around to the edges of the petals, then down to the tips of the lateral sepals then following the lower extremity of the labellum. The petals are rounded as is the labellum and the colour is good. It displayed 2 flowers and the width was 85mm and the length, top to bottom was 77mm. Substance, which we say is firmness of the flower flesh, was reasonable. This orchid is not in the class of an AM or FCC.

This orchid is Cattleya Royal Beau 'Dendi' and gained a First Class Certificate. The flower is well balanced, has good colour and forms an almost perfect circular outline of the flower. This is a very good flower.

Awarding Orchids

This orchid is

Bulbophyllum lobbii 'Murph' and gained an Awared of Cultural Excellence for its owner. Cultural awards are granted to an owner while the other awards are granted to the plant. We can see from the photograph that it is a very large plant, carries a large number of flowers and that the foliage is in very good condition. Well deserved to the owners.



This orchid is

Vanda *ampullacea* 'Hayley Carius' which was awarded an Award of Distinction for the unusual white colour. This award is given to an orchid displaying characteristics not usually seen. It can be for unusual colour, size, splash petals, peloric flowers, and other oddities.

There has to be a majority of judges in favour of any award for it to be granted. If awarded, the owner of the plant is required to complete an Application for Award and is required to supply details about the plant. Then 'colour cards' are used to get the nearest colour to all parts of the flower and measurements of the flower have to be taken. Photographs of the flower and the plant have to be taken. If they're lucky, the judges get a cuppa and a bikkie. **Mal.**
