Steve Yeoman wins the STOCQ Trophy for Best Species in 2020

For the second time in three years, Steve has been awarded the Subtropical Orchid Council's Trophy for Best Species awarded by AOC Judges in the region.

The award was for his *Bulbophyllum frostii* 'David Lee' which received an Award of Merit in December, 2020. Congratulations again to Steve. This award is for the best of the best within the STOCQ area. Occurrence of Bulbophyllum frostii is widespread in Vietnam and is occasionally seen in Thailand and the Malay Peninsula. It falls within the Section Cirrhopetalum and is sometimes referred to as the Dutchman Shoe Orchid because the flowers resemble clogs in shape.

Reminder to use the same chair for the duration of the meeting.



Species

Plant of the Month - Dendrobium dearei - Rod & Jan







Plant of Botanical Interest - Zootrophion atropurpureum comes from Cuba & Jamaica and is a member of the Pleurothallis family. The stem has a number of nodes with the single leaf coming from the top of the stem. The junction with the leaf is covered by a bract, the flower stem also comes from within this bract. I have had this plant for a number of years but it has not flowered before. It has spent the last year or so in the Bulbophyllum house under 75% shade with regular watering. It has been rather neglected nutrient wise but now it is flowering, so maybe it likes to be a bit hungry, at least near flowering time. **Duncan**

Bulbophyllum maquilingense Ames (1932) is a member of the section Megaloglossum. Common name the Mount Makiling Bulbophyllum named after the mountain it was found on in Luzon Philippines.



This is the first time we have seen this one at a species get together and almost requires a magnifying glass to be able to see the flowers which are approximately 1cm and grow from the base of the pseudobulb. There can be as many as eight flowers from each pseudobulb that hold well above the leaves.

Found at elevations of 800 to 1000 meters on tree trunks in partial shade and prefers mounts. Warm growing epiphyte with a creeping, branching rhizome giving rise to fairly close set, ovoid smooth or grooved, pseudobulbs. This miniature blooms in the spring in its natural habitat.

Note. This little plant likes to shut its eyes at lunch time as reflected in the photo taken by **Charlie**. Reference: Bulbophyllums and Their Allies Seigerist 2001.
